## Directions from Pittsburgh

Phone: 304-947-5446, you are welcome to call when you are 45 minutes out and we will know to look for you.

## Print & read the directions in advance. Do NOT rely on GPS, especially once outside of Berkeley Springs or Paw Paw or YOU WILL GET LOST!! Also, gas up. There are no gas stations in Great Cacapon!!

- From PA Turnpike (I-76) East for 54 miles
- Take exit 110 toward US 219/Somerset/Johnstown
- Merge onto Turnpike Road which becomes N Pleasant Ave
- Turn left on E. Main St / PA 31
- Turn right on Plank Rd which becomes Berlin Plank Rd which becomes US 219
- Turn left on Main Street
- Turn right onto Cumberland St/PA-160.
- Follow PA 160 about 7 miles into Maryland (where PA 160 becomes Barrelville Rd NW)
- Turn left onto Mount Savage Rd/MD 36, this will turn into US Alt 40
- Stay straight and US Alt 40 will turn into N Mechanic St. and then into MD-51
- Follow MD 51 South about 22 miles to Paw Paw, WV (when you cross the Potomac River you enter Paw Paw and US-51 becomes Rt. 9)
- From Paw Paw (gas station), go about 1.5 miles and take a sharp left onto Magnolia Rd. Set odometer.
- Follow Magnolia Rd for 4.5 miles. You will come to a stop sign.
- Go straight at stop sign and continue on Magnolia for 2.2 miles. It's a long downhill and just as it levels out at the bottom the road bends to the right. Continue until you GO UNDER THE TRAIN BRIDGE.
- At this point the pavement ends and the road forks into 2 dirt roads, TAKE THE LEFT FORK (do not go back under the railroad bridge!).
- You are now on Low Line Road (or "River Road"). NOW STOP & SET YOUR ODOMETER! You are 3.6 miles from Three Otters;
- **NOTE:** This is a rough, bouncy ride for the first half mile so go slowly. You will know you are going the right way when you pass under an abandoned railroad bridge in about 0.4 miles and the river will be on your left;
- Three Otters will be on your left. The driveway is the last possible left turn before you come to another retired train bridge. If you come to this bridge, you have gone too far. Just turn around and take your first RIGHT.

\*Low Line Road (River Road) is a hard packed gravel road which is an old railroad bed. It has big dips and large gravel which makes it a bumpy road. While there is no risk of getting stuck, after a heavy rain some of the dips can fill with water, so skirt to one side or another. Do not go through the middle.
